THE PCC MET FOUR TIMES in the year 2016.

Nine members were elected at the annual meeting; four members sit ex-officio (with two vacancies - The Twiston Warden and the second Deanery Synod representative) making thirteen members in total.

Attendance at PCC meetings in 2016 averaged eleven members.
